THIS WEEK'S SAINTS, FROM THE 4TH CENTURY TO MODERN AMERICA. On November 10th, we remember Leo the Great, pope and doctor of the Church, who died on November 10, 461. As Bishop of Rome, and successor of Peter, he is known as one of the best administrative popes of the early Church. He fought against the heresies of Pelagianism and Manichaeism, defended doctrinal orthodoxy with the Church of the East, defended Rome against barbarian attacks, especially the attack of Atilla the Hun, and wrote spiritually profound works for the pastoral care of his people.

Martin of Tours, born of pagan parents in Pannonia, present-day Hungary, in 316 AD, was baptized a Catholic Christian at the age of 18. During his military service, he lived more like a monk than a soldier. He established the first monastery in France, near Poitiers, where he lived for 10 years, until being called to Tours, under the ruse of the need to care for a sick person, but in reality to be the bishop of that city. Some of the consecrating bishops thought his disheveled appearance and unkempt hair made him undignified to be a bishop. Martin worked against the errors of the Arian heresy, and yet still fought for mercy and clemency in dealing with heretics, even when the emperor called for their execution. Martin is often times pictured seated on a horse and cutting his military cloak to give to a poor beggar, who was Christ in disguise.

Josaphat Kuncevic, born in 1580, a monk of St. Basil, worked tirelessly for the Union of Brest-Litovsk which brought millions of Ruthenians and Ukrainians of the Eastern Rite into union with Rome. So successful was he in promoting the union, that the Orthodox called him the "thief of souls." An angry mob in Vitebsk broke into his house, struck his head, shot him and threw him into the river on November 12, 1623. His body was recovered and is buried in Biala, Poland. He is the patron saint of Church Unity.

Frances Xavier Cabrini, born in 1850 in Italy the youngest of 13 children, became the first American citizen to be canonized a saint. From childhood she wanted to be a missionary to China. She entered religious life in Italy and came to New York City with 6 sisters to work among the many Italian immigrants in America. She faced many difficulties and challenges, and many times did not find support for her work from the leadership of the Church. But for 35 years she persevered in her work. Although small in stature she accomplished much, including the establishment of orphanages, schools, hospitals, convents and other institutions to help the poor. She died of malaria in her own Columbus Hospital in Chicago in 1917. She was canonized by Pope Pius XII in 1946 and is the patron saint of immigrants. Her body is buried at the Frances Cabrini Shrine in Upper Manhattan, New York.

DANES JE 32. NAVADNA NEDELJA.

DRUŽINSKA PERSPEKTIVA. Današnjega Evangelija prilika bi morala biti budnica "bodite pripravljeni" za prihod Jezusa na konec sveta. Kako mi govorimo o smrti in žalosti kot družina? Ali mi hočemo skriti resničnost smrti našim otrokom? Besede Sv. Pavla v drugem berilu nam poudarjajo "da se ne boste žalostili, kakor tisti, kateri nimajo upanja." Kot kristjani, mi še vedno žalujemo kadar eden naših dragih ali prijatelj umrje, tudi ko mi upamo na vstajenje. Kako vaša družina pomaga drugim v ravnanju z žalostjo?

SVETNIKI TEGA TEDNA SO OD 4. STOLETJA DO MODERNE AMERIKE. 10. novembra se spomnimo Leona Velikega, papeža in cerkvenega učitelja, ki je umrl 10. novembra 461. Kot škof Rima in naslednik Sv. Petra je poznan kot eden od najboljših administrativnih papežev zgodnje Cerkve. On se je bojeval proti krivi veri, branil doktrino prave vere z Cerkvijo na Vzhodu, branil Rim proti barbarskim napadom, posebno napad Hunskega kralja Atila in pisal globoka duhovna pisma za pastoralno skrb njegovega ljudstva. Martin od Tours, rojen od poganskih staršev v Panoniji, sedanji Madžarski v letu 316, in bil krščen v starosti 18 let, med njegovim služenjem v vojski je on živel bolj kot menih ne kot vojak. On je ustanovil prvi samostan v Franciji, blizu Poitiers, kjer je živel 10 let, dokler ni bil poklican v Tours, z zvijačo da skrbi za bolnika, toda v resnici je bilo, da bo škof tega mesta. Nekateri posvečeni škofje so mislili, da njegova mršava zunanjost in skuštrane lase, naredi njega neplemenitega biti škof. Martin je delal proti napakam Arijanske krive vere in vendar se je še vedno boril za usmiljenje in dobrotljivost v poslovanju s krivoverci, celo kadar je cesar zahteval za njihovo usmrtitev. Martin je velikokrat naslikan sedeč na konju, ki reže svojo vojaško suknjo, da jo da ubogemu beraču, ki je bil v pretvari Kristus. Jozafat Kunčevič, rojen 1580, menih Sv. Bazilija On je neutrudno delal za Zvezo Brest-Litovsk kar je prineslo Rusine in Ukrajince od Vzhodnega obreda v zvezo z Rimom. Bil je tako uspešen v pospeševanju zveze da so ga pravoslavni imenovali, da je "tat duš." Jezen razgrajač v Vitebsku je vlomil v njegovo hišo, udaril po glavi, ga ustrelil in vrgel v reko 12. novembra 1623. Njegovo telo so našli in je pokopan v Biali na Poljskem. On je svetnik patron za Cerkveno enotnost. Frančiška Xavier Cabrini, rojena 1850 v Italiji, najmlajša od 13 otrok in prva Ameriška državljanka, da je bila razglašena za svetnico. Že od otroštva je hotela biti misijonarka na Kitajskem. Ona je vstopila v redovniško življenje v Italiji in prišla v mesto New York s 6 redovnicami, da delajo med Italjanskimi imigranti v Ameriki. Ona se je soočila z mnogimi težavami in izzivi, ker velikokrat ni našla podpore za njeno delo od vodstva Cerkve. Toda za 35 let je ona vztrajala pri njenem delu. Čeprav majhne postave, ona je dovršila veliko, vključno ustanovila sirotišnice, šole, bolnišnice, samostane in druge ustanove za pomoč ubogim. Ona je umrla za malarijo v njeni lastni bolnici Columbus v Chicagu leta 1917. Papež Pij XII jo je razglasil za svetnico 1946 leta in je svetnica patrona za imigrante. Njeno telo je pokopano v svetišču Frančiške Cabrini v Upper Manhattanu v New Yorku.
