A WEEK OF WOMEN SAINTS. November 16th, is the feast of ST. MARGARET OF SCOTLAND, who wasn't Scottish, but Hungarian. When she was 12 years old, she and her family were brought to the court of King Edward the Confessor in England, but were forced to flee England after the battle of Hastings in 1066. They were given refuge in Scotland and King Malcolm III was so taken by Margaret that he married her in 1070 at Dunfermline Castle. She softened Malcolm's rather uncouth behavior and harsh temper and promoted the arts and education in her adopted county, as well as serving as advisor to the king. She was also known for her personal piety, wisdom, and interest in the reform of abuses in the Church. She and Malcolm had 6 sons and 2 daughters, and basically homeschooled them all. She died in Edinburgh Castle on November 16, 1093, four days after learning that her husband, Malcolm, and oldest son, Edward, had been killed by rebels in Alnwick Castle. She was canonized in 1250 and declared patroness of Scotland in 1673.

ST. GERTURDE, whose feast is also celebrated on November 16th, was one of the great mystics of the 13th century. At the age of five, she was placed in the care of the Benedictine nuns in Helfta, Saxony, where she spent the rest of her life. She became a nun, and at the age of 26 began to experience visions of Christ. Her spiritual life was a deep union with Jesus and his Sacred Heart, rooted in the rhythm of the liturgical life of the Church and Holy Scripture. She died on November 17, 1302, and though never formally canonized, in 1677, Pope Clement XII directed that her feast be observed by the Universal Church.

ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY was born in Pressburg (modern day Bratislava, Slovakia) in 1207. She married Ludwig of Thuringia in 1221 and had 4 children. She and her husband were seen as an ideal couple. She was known for her great prayer and charity to the poor, and would even dress in the simplest of clothing as she distributed bread to the poor. After only 6 years of marriage, Ludwig died from the plague while fighting in the Crusades. After his death, Ludwig's family accused her of mismanaging his estate by giving away so much to the poor, and threw her out of her residence at Wartburg castle. After making provisions for her children, she moved to Marburg and became a Third Order Franciscan. When her husband's allies returned after the Crusade, her son was recognized as the legitimate heir to the castle, and Elizabeth was allowed to return. She spent the last 4 years of her life in deep humility and poverty caring for the poor, sick and aged in a hospital she had built in honor of St. Francis near the castle. She died before her 24th birthday in 1231.

Kadar mi slišimo današnjo priliko in druge podobne, mi moramo biti premaknjeni k dejanju, ko se mi investiramo in naše družine bolj in bolj polno v krščansko življenje. Kaj je eden dar ali talent, ki ste ga prejeli iz rok Boga in ga rabite, da strežete vaši družini, vaši župniji in božjim ljudem?

TEDEN SVETNIC. 16. novembra ima god Sv. Marjeta Škotska ki ni bila škotinja ampak madžarka. Ko je bila stara 12 let, so bili ona in njena družina pripeljani na dvor kralja Edvarda, v Angliji, toda so morali bežati iz Anglije po boju Hastings leta 1066. Prejeli so zatočišče na Škotskem in kralj Malcolm III je bil tako zavzet za Marjeto, da jo je poročil leta 1070 na gradu Dunfermline. Ona je omehčala Malcolma precej neotesano obnašanje in osorni značaj in pospeševala umetnost in izobraževanje v njeni prisvojeni deželi in bila tudi svetovalka kralju. Ona je bila tudi znana za njeno osebno pobožnost, modrost in interesirana v reformo zlorabe v Cerkvi. On in Malcolm sta imela 6 sinov in 2 hčeri in vsi šolani doma. Ona je umrla na gradu Edinburg, 16. novembra 1093, štiri dni potem ko izve, da njen mož Malcolm in najstarejši sin Edvard sta bila ubita od upornikov na gradu Alnwick. Ona je bila razglašena za svetnico leta 1250 in napovedana patrona Škotske v 1673.

Sv. Jedrt, katere god je tudi 16. novembra je bila ena od velikih mistikov v 13 stoletju. Ko je bila stara 5 let, so jo dali v oskrbo k Benediktinskim redovnicam v Helfta, Saxony, kjer je preživela vse njeno življenje. Postala je redovnica in v starosti 26 let je začela doživljati vizije Kristusa. Njeno duhovno življenje je bilo globoka zveza z Jezusom in njegovo Sveto Srce, ukoreninjeno v ritem liturgičnega življenja Cerkve in Svetega pisma. Umrla je 17. novembra 1302, in čeprav ni bila nikoli formalno razglašena za svetnico je 1677 leta papež Klemen XII naslovil, da se njen god praznuje po Vesoljni Cerkvi. Elizabeta Ogrska, je bila rojena v Pressburgu (sedaj Bratislava, Slovakija) leta 1207. Ona se je poročila z Ludvikom, knezom Turingije leta 1221, imela sta 4 otroke in ona in njen mož sta bila videt idealen par. Ona je bila znana za njeno molitev in dobroto za uboge in se je tudi oblekla v najbolj navadno obleko, ko je delila kruh ubogim. Po 6 letih zakona je Ludvik umrl za kugo ko se je boril v križarski vojni. Po njegovi smrti je Ludvikova družina obdolžila njo, da slabo opravlja njegovo posestvo, ker preveč razdaja ubogim in so jo vrgli ven iz njenega bivanja na gradu Wartburg. Potem ko je uredila oskrbe za otroke, se je preselila v Marburg in postala Frančiškanka Tretjega reda. Ko so se njenega moža zavezniki vrnili po križarski vojni je bil njen sin prepoznan kot zakonit dedič na gradu in Elizabeti je bilo dovoljeno da se vrne. Ona je preživela zadnja 4 leta njenega življenja v ponižnosti in uboštvu Skrbela je za uboge, bolnike in stare v bolnici, ki jo je zgradila v čast Sv. Frančišku blizu gradu. Umrla je pred njenim 24. rojstnim dnevom leta 1231.
