WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY: January 18th to January 25th. One of the greatest sins of the followers of Jesus Christ is the division and discord that has divided believers. Political intrigue, jealousy, abuse of power and theological misunderstanding have torn apart the Body of Christ. We pray, as Jesus prayed, that we may be one as He and his Heavenly Father are one. This is a week for Christian churches to look deeply into our past and seek healing for the wounds of division among the faithful. How many non-Christians look at us with utter dismay when we call for unity and peace in the world while we still suffer from so much mistrust and division among ourselves. Like the ancient patriarchal Churches of Jerusalem, Antioch, Alexandria, Constantinople and Rome who each developed their own diverse customs and traditions, there was always the unifying foundation of one Church, one Lord, one Baptism, one Eucharist, one Faith. We conclude this week of prayer on the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, a reminder that we are all called to a conversion of heart and spirit as we pray and work for greater unity in the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church.
